Primary School Information

As we end week 7 of term 1, we want to thank you for your support in the last six weeks of school. We are grateful for the immense support you have shown either through your responses to our notices or ensuring your children are equipped with the resources required for their learning needs.

As we approach Easter season and conclusion of Term 1, we also would like to highlight a number of areas for the sake of continuous collaboration and support for one another as parents and teachers working together. The success of our students academically, emotionally, socially and mentally hinges on a cordial partnership between us as parents and teachers.

In order to foster such harmonies and meaningful partnership, it is incumbent on everyone of us to play our various roles respectfully and consistently. In doing so, we want to highlight the following areas that can make our efforts become a reality.

Attendance

Attendance to school is crucial as it plays an important role in the learning progress of students. Students frequently missing lessons struggle to catchup in class and creates a big gap in their learning. Absence from school also have psychological consequences in the life of a student which can lead to low self-esteem and related social behaviours. Students with very high absence either consecutively or cumulatively will struggle when moving to the next grade. We are encouraging all parents to send your children to school every day.

Coming Late to School

Being on time is a fundamental life skill and defines once character. Additionally, it has serious psychological implications on students' minds and affects their ability to focus on their learning. Students who come late disturb the whole class our students are very conscious of that. To help our students have a good start to their day of learning, we encourage parents to bring your children to school before 7:45 a.m. so they can be part of morning procedures in school.

School Gates

For safety reasons we are hereby informing all our good parents that the Church and Mavaru gates will be closed at 8:00 a.m. Students who are late after 8:00 a.m. will have to be dropped off at the Vaivai Gate. This change will be effective as of week 8.

Morning Drop Off/Afternoon Pickup

Kindly be informed that starting in week 8, drop off and pickup will be from the gate only. We are requesting your understanding and consideration to respect our students and teachers learning space and refrain from walking into corridors and classrooms. Exceptions will be made during wet weather and wet weather procedures will be followed.

Afternoon Pickup Time

Our official pickup time for primary school is 3:00 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. We are very concerned that some students are being picked up as late as 5:30 p.m. from school. For safety reasons we would like to encourage all parents to pick up your child before 4:00 p.m. or organise for their pick up if you are unable to pick them up on time. We are looking at improving this particular procedure to bring some form of accountability to those concern.

Invitation to School Activities

We are grateful to parents who have been supportive in attending our assemblies, sports and meetings. We are encouraging more parents to be part of our activities and be part of your child's celebration of learning either on Fridays and Mondays for assemblies or on Saturdays for sports. We currently have our weekend sports and we welcome parents who are willing to be coaches or trainers for our futsal teams and other sports going forward.

Grievance Policy

We all have concerns and we want to make sure our children get the best of their time in school. This often leads to concerns with teaching and learning or extra-curricular activities. Kindly be mindful that there are established procedures in place to follow if you wish to raise your concern. It is important that we use positive example of good citizenship when raising our concerns. We request that parents be mindful of confrontational approaches to resolving concerns as it does not show good example to students. Kindly use the diary to communicate your concern.

If the matter is concerning a staff member, please contact the Deputy Principals through email or see the Office Administration Staff assist you accordingly and make an appointment to speak with them. If the issue is of serious nature, refer your concern to the Principal immediately.

- MARCELLA House/classrooms are named after Sr Marcella, who, with Sr Carthage founded St Josephs International Catholic College in 1917.
- CHEVALIER House/Classrooms are named after Fr Jules Chevalier.

We who work with the MSC and OLSH congregations are 'Partners in Mission. That mission is being expressed in the motto seen in all our classrooms around our school: May the Sacred Heart of Jesus be everywhere loved, to remind us all that if we can know the way God loves by knowing Jesus, it would change the world if everyone loved like Him!

As a part of the Chevalier Family, we are therefore invited too to come along and celebrate the life of Fr Jules Chevalier with the priests, religious brothers, sisters and other lay Chevalier members on Saturday 16th March 2024. Happy Birthday, Fr Jules Chevalier.
